In 2016, 23% were professors, academics, and researchers; 19% were students and trainees; 12% were business professionals/technical assistance agencies, and 11% were healthcare works. Others included participants from laboratory facilities, industry and advocacy and granting organizations.

2 of every 5 Summer Institute participants were from LMIC countries.

94% of Summer Institute participants would recommend the course they attended to their colleagues.
